Africa Rise Youth Indaba 2025

JOHANNESBURG: DRAFT YOUTH POLICY COMMITMENT CHARTER AND DECLARATION

Adopted in Johannesburg, South Africa, 22 May 2025

PREAMBLE

We, the youth of Africa, together with government ministers, development partners, private sector leaders, civil society organizations, scholars, and diplomats, gathered at the inaugural Africa Rise Youth Indaba 2025 (ARYI 2025) under the theme:

Policy to Prosperity: Redefining Africa's Youth Development Architecture

Recognizing that:

- Africa is home to the largest and fastest-growing youth population in the world, representing an unmatched opportunity for economic, social, and political transformation,
- Despite numerous youth development policies, the persistent gap between policy commitments and actual outcomes continues to hinder youth empowerment, and
- The African Union Agenda 2063, the United Nations Youth 2030 Strategy, and the European Union Youth Strategy call for immediate, inclusive, and sustained youth-driven action.

We reaffirm that the success of Africa's development agenda hinges on the full and active participation of its young people, and the establishment of systems that ensure their voices shape, lead, and sustain change.

OUR VISION

We envision an Africa where every young person, regardless of background, gender, geography, or status, is fully empowered to lead, innovate, create, participate, and prosper.







OUR COMMITMENTS

In pursuit of this vision, we collectively commit to the following actions:

- 1. Strengthen Policy Implementation and Accountability
- Ensure all youth policies and programs are equipped with clear timelines, adequate resources, measurable indicators, and transparent monitoring frameworks.
- Establish national and continental Youth Policy Accountability Platforms, led by youth networks and independent observers.

2. Drive Economic Empowerment and Innovation

- Create inclusive ecosystems for youth entrepreneurship, innovation, and decent job creation, especially within green economies, creative industries, digital transformation, and agri-tech.
- Operationalize the ARYI Innovation Fund 2025 to seed and scale youth-led enterprises.

3. Guarantee Meaningful Civic and Political Participation

- Institutionalize mechanisms for youth co-creation of national policies, public budgets, governance processes, peacebuilding efforts, and electoral reforms.
- Establish or strengthen National Youth Coordinating Mechanisms (NYCMs) across all African states.

4. Champion Inclusivity and Diversity

- Center the leadership and inclusion of young women, rural youth, youth with disabilities, indigenous youth, and marginalized communities across all youth development actions.
- Mandate gender parity in youth leadership structures at all levels.

5. Align Youth Action with Continental and Global Development Agendas

- Integrate Agenda 2063 and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into national youth policies, youth budgeting frameworks, and monitoring systems.
- Build intergenerational solidarity to achieve these goals collaboratively.

6. Invest in Youth Mental Health, Education, and Well-being

- Prioritize youth-centered reforms in education systems to align with future skills.
- Implement comprehensive mental health, nutrition, and well-being support systems for young people, particularly during transitions to adulthood and employment.







OUR IMMEDIATE ACTIONS

We resolve to:

- Launch a Youth Development Accountability Tracker monitored jointly by youth, governments, and development partners, reporting annually.
- Convene an annual Africa Youth Policy Impact Forum to evaluate progress.
- Scale the Agenda 2063 Youth Challenge solutions across the continent.
- Mobilize at least \$10 million new investment through the ARYI INNOVATION FUND by 2027.

OUR CALL TO ACTION

We call on:

- Governments to prioritize youth in all national development plans and budgets.
- The African Union to strengthen continental accountability on youth action through enhanced reporting mechanisms.
- Development Partners to invest directly in youth-led solutions, not just youth-focused programs.
- Private Sector to unlock opportunities for youth employment, investment, and leadership.
- Civil Society and Academia to support youth knowledge generation, civic engagement, and innovation.
